

(UPDATED 8/4/2015) Current Federal Regulations in Abrir La Sierra Bank, Bajo de Sico, and Tourmaline Bank Remain in Effect Until Further Notice

The Caribbean Fishery Management Council (Council) met on August 12-13, 2014 in Río Grande, Puerto Rico. One topic of discussion centered around three managed areas (Abrir La Sierra Bank, Bajo de Sico, and Tourmaline Bank), partially or fully within federal waters off the west coast of Puerto Rico. These areas are accessed for commercial and recreational harvest. At present, harvest regulations differ among the three areas, creating confusion among fishers and enforcement personnel and apparently reducing compliance rates. With the goal of reducing confusion, increasing compliance rates, and protecting spawning aggregations and the habitat upon which they depend in these areas, the Council identified preferred alternatives for revising management of these areas based on public input and scientific evidence.

During the April 21-22, 2015 meeting in St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands, the Council revised their preferred alternative for Action 1 (Reef Fish Harvest). The table below summarizes the current and proposed regulations that would be implemented if the preferred alternatives identified by the Council are submitted to and approved by the Secretary of Commerce. The Council has not finalized these regulations. Therefore, the current federal regulations remain in place until further notice.

¹ use of bottom-tending gear (pots, traps, bottom longlines, gillnets, and trammel nets) is prohibited

² as defined in §635.21(a)(4)(iv), as fishing with lines trailing behind a vessel which is in constant motion at speeds in excess of four knots with a visible wake. Such trolling may not involve the use of down riggers, wire lines, planers, or similar devices.
